demic may have crushed the NMI's hopes for economic growth in 2020, but not the team spirit that the island community has shown for the past several months to get through this crisis and beyond.

From the initial 10 groups, 34 have now come together to support the Public Private Partnership initiative of the Governor's Council of Economic Advisers, as they have adopted 22 sites to prove their commitment to this destination enhancement campaign. GCEA and its partners see the initiative as a game-changer in the NMI's bid to be a worldclass destination and revitalize the tourism industry—the driving force of the islands' economy that was hardly hit by the pandemic.

"This downtime due to the pandemic gave us the opportunity to look at the improvements we must do in our sites and other key areas in our islands to make the NMI better prepared in welcoming back visitors. We are excited with all these enhancement and beautification projects and we would like to thank our entire community for rallying behind this campaign," said Gov. Ralph DLG Torres, who co-chairs the GCEA with Jerry Tan.

Business establishments,

government agencies, sports federations, non-government organizations, and ethnic groups have signed a five-year agreement with the PPP initiative and part of their commitment to the campaign is doing maintenance work at their adopted sites. Majority of these groups have been holding regular clean-up drives since August. They also did both minor and major repairs on facilities/features in their respected sites and conducted assessments for future projects.

Through the collaborative efforts of the 34 groups and other stakeholders that are encouraged to join the cause soon, GCEA is positive that the NMI will be able to showcase more the beauty of the islands, its rich culture, and the hospitality of its people. With everyone contributing to this initiative, GCEA is hopeful that NMI tourism can ramp back up and regenerate the jobs and tax revenues we need to get through the pandemic and gain momentum towards building a stronger economy that benefits us all.

"We, as one community, have proven time and again that we can overcome challenges. We did it when we had Soudelor and Yutu. Now, we have this pandemic and we will all come out of this stronger and better. Together, we can CNMI," Torres said.
